

Descendants of Andrew Johnson "Johnsee" Manning

Andrew Johnson "Johnsee" Manning was born in Giles County, Virginia, in August 1851 according to information in one published source. Based on his age when he was married, his date of birth would be August 9, 1853. I do not know his correct date of birth. Andrew died August 15, 1923 in Saxon, Raleigh County, West Virginia.

I have not learned the names of Andrew's parents. Andrew was left an orphan at the age of eighteen months. He was reared by two bachelor uncles and a widowed aunt in Giles County, Virginia.

From the above census records, we learn the names of the two uncles of Andrew were Andrew and James. Margaret was his aunt. Andrew came to live with his uncles and aunt after the 1850 census was taken.

After the death of his uncles, he was thrown out into the world on his own resources and shaped his own career. Andrew traveled over the country doing various kinds of work. He worked on farms, railroad grades, at brickyard and lime kilns, and on steamboats. He was employed by traveling with a circus at one point in his life. Andrew attended school whenever he had the opportunity until he became qualified to teach. He taught schools fourteen sessions. He was school superintendent in Raleigh County for one term. Eventually he became a farmer, buying and selling produce. He was elected to the state legislature from Raleigh County in 1920.

Andrew married Clementine "Clem" Trump on August 16, 1882, in Raleigh County, West Virginia. Clementine was the daughter of William Trump and Sarah Cozart. She was born February 26, 1865, in Raleigh County, West Virginia, and died September 14, 1942, in Raleigh County, West Virginia.

elected on the Republican ticket. Then in 1920 he was nominated by the same party for House of Delegates and elected, serving his constituents at Charleston in the legislature of 1921. He was a farmer and was respected by all of his neighbors and friends, having also taught school for a number of years prior to his election as school superintendent.

He came to Raleigh County from Virginia, having been born in Carroll county, in the Old Dominion. It was a short time after his arrival here that he married Miss Trump, a native of the county. He had many friends in addition to his large family who regret to learn of his death.

Funeral services will be held this afternoon from his home and the remains will be laid to rest in the cemetery on the old home place.

1. C. Lawrence "Cap" Manning was born about May 1883, and died about 1934. He married Bertha Acord on October 5, 1904, in Raleigh County, West Virginia. She was the daughter of John Acord and Pauline Morris. Bertha was born March 17, 1888, and died July 15, 1966.
2. Bertie Alice Manning, born April 29, 1885, in Raleigh County, West Virginia, died September 21, 1971. She married Albert William Honaker on September 3, 1902, in Raleigh County, West Virginia. Albert was born April 13, 1879, and died October 30, 1961.
3. Lottie E Manning, born about April 1887, married Lewis Sizemore on October 26, 1904, in Raleigh County, West Virginia.
4. Edward Hubert (Hubbard) "Hub" Manning, born about February 1889. He married Cittie (Zetta) Lucas who was born about December 1892.
5. Cecelia Clara Manning was born March 7, 1891, and died June 15, 1986, in Beckley, Raleigh County, West Virginia. She married Henry Harrison Lucas on September 14, 1906, in Raleigh County, West Virginia. Henry was the son of William Lucas and Almira Milam. Henry was born October 16, 1885, and died January 9, 1952.
6. Ollie Belle Manning was born about March 1893, and died May 13, 1990, in Raleigh County, West Virginia. She married first Archibald "Arch" Daniel in 1910. Archibald, the son of William Daniel and Elizabeth Pettry, was born in August 1872. She married

second Marion Freer Eskew in 1944. Marion, the son of P. Eskew and Emma _____, was born March 11, 1883, and died December 13, 1973.

7. William Augustus "Gus" Manning was born April 20, 1895, in West Virginia, and died December 30, 1984. He married Bessie Ellen Bailey on April 22, 1915, daughter of William Bailey and Isabelle Shumate. She was born about 1898 in West Virginia.

8. Sarah Maude Manning, born December 26, 1896, married Isaac Snuffer; born May 27, 1890, in Bolt, Raleigh County, West Virginia.

9. Winford (Winifred) Montgomery Manning, born June 03, 1899; died December 26, 1977. He married Minnie Maude Darlington on April 23, 1919, in Arnett, Raleigh County, West Virginia. Minnie was born June 6, 1901, in West Virginia, and died February 26, 1975.

10. Ole "Oley" Johnson Manning, born March 24, 1901, died in September 1957. He married first Eunice Daniel. Eunice was born April 12, 1906, at Dry Creek, Raleigh County. She was the daughter of James Thomas "Tom" Daniel and Bertha Jane Barrett. Eunice died September 11, 1947, at Bolt and is buried at the Calfee Cemetery. Oley married second Hester Lusk; born September 29, 1914, in Herndon, Wyoming County, West Virginia. Hester died January 10, 2005, in Beckley, Raleigh County. She is buried at Blue Ridge Memorial Gardens.

Hester Manning, 90, of Beckley, died Monday, Jan. 10, 2005, at her residence.

Born on Sept. 29, 1914, at Herndon, W.Va., she was one of 14 children born to the late John and Georgia Lusk.

Mrs. Manning, after graduating from Herndon High School and Concord College, began her career as a school teacher in Wyoming County. She retired from the Raleigh County School System in June 1975, where she had taught for many years.

Mrs. Manning was a long time resident of Fairdale, W.Va., and a member of the Coal Marsh Missionary Baptist Church.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Oley J. Manning in September 1957; a sister, Nola Brooks of Lynco; and her brothers, Amos Lusk of Sophia, Aven Lusk of Gallipolis, Ohio, Harold Lusk of Henderson, N.C., and Burless Lusk of Corinne.

Survivors include her sisters, Lebern "Til" and Garnet Lusk, both of Beckley, Melda Bridges of Houma, La., Ilma Murray of Davison, Mich., and Geva Byrd of San Jose, Calif.; her brothers, Mason Lusk of Centerville, Va., Morris Lusk of Itmann and Harry Lusk of Flint, Mich.
